BECOME GUINNESS™ WORLD RECORD HOLDERS – AND HELP SAVE WILD-LIFE AT THE SAME TIME!

On May 19th 2017, a truly unique event will be taking place all across the UK. Hundreds of thousands of primary school children will be taking part in an attempt to break a Guinness™ World Record. On that day, primary schools up and down the country will be joining together to try and break the world record for a **mass sponsored walk**. (The current world record is 231,635 people all walking at the same time!)

As well as attempting to break the world record, schools will also be raising money for wildlife protection and conservation. Unlike other organised sponsored walks however, schools choose where to walk and more importantly where the money goes. We can raise money for any wildlife charity, big or small. The only criteria set is that everyone will need to be walking at 2.15pm on the 19th May, to be included in the Guinness World Record™ attempt.

As part of further cooperation/collaboration between our cluster schools, two children from each school in our cluster – The George Stephenson Learning Community (GSLC) have been invited to join **Stretton Handley Primary School to take part in the Woolley Moor Trail**, a local area walk devised by Stretton Handley children that is featured in Derbyshire guide books.

We have chosen to raise funds for a wildlife charity – **the RSPB**. A sponsorship form is enclosed. Your child will need to bring their sponsor form back into school for us to sign on the day of the walk to verify they have completed the walk. Money should then be collected and returned to school with the forms. Thank you very much.

The walk will take place during the afternoon and children will be back at school to be collected as usual. Children need to wear clothes suitable for walking outdoors. If rain is forecast, they will need a waterproof coat or if we are lucky enough for it to be warm sunny, a hat and sun cream will be required. Children will need suitable footwear as it may be muddy. Children may also like to bring a biscuit snack and a water bottle.
