### **Home Learning Guidelines for Children and Parents**

Dear Parents and Carers,

In response to a number of schools in the area having to close either classes, year groups or the whole school we have decided to review our home learning strategy.

We have developed a new home learning guidance for pupils and parents on the expectations of what the children should be doing at home if they are off school because of Covid19.

It is our responsibility to provide children to work that they can do from home if they have to self-isolate due to Covid19. It is the responsibility of the children, particularly in Kingfisher class, to engage with the work set. Children in Woodpeckers class may need more support from parents at home to help them with this.

Because of this school has invested in a number of teaching and learning tools to support them that the children will be able to access when they are in school and when they are at home.

These include:

DoJo an app that parents and children will need to download at home (they will be given log in details) and will be used by the class teacher to communicate and share work with parents and children.

Spelling Frame – children will be given a log in and direct link to this and is a fun way for children to learn spellings.

TT Rock Stars children will be given a log in and direct link to support the learning of times tables

I Hub children will be given a log in and direct link to support and develop comprehension skills.

We will also be using the Oak Academy to support the teaching of some lessons.

The children already know how to access Education City and may at times be directed to this by the teacher.

We will be updating the school website with all the necessary links added for ease of access.



Many of the activities are designed so the children can work on these independently. However, if your child is struggling with anything please get them to contact their teacher on class DoJo. The teacher will also use class DoJo to communicate with children and parents.

If it is not the whole class or school that is off, then your class teacher will still be teaching in school. This may mean a delay in responding to you on class DoJo so please be patient and try to do as much as you can until they get chance to reply to you.

We have included a daily timetable that the children should be following to support the teaching and learning that would take place in school.

The children should follow the timetable as closely as possible and will have this explained to them in school this week.

We have also included links to make it easy for the children to click on so they can go straight to the activities.

Each Class will have similar activities related to the age they are working at. Each child has been given a home school book to record their work in. They should share their work with the class teacher on class DoJo. These guidelines should be followed if either an individual is isolating or the whole class/school is having to isolate.

The daily timetable that the children should work to can be found on:

- Class DoJo
- The Home Learning Page on the School Website
- A paper copy that the children have in their book bags
- A message sent on Parent Hub

We expect to have all the above up and running and in place by Friday 20<sup>th</sup> November.

In these uncertain times it is important that the children try to continue with their daily education.

Your support in helping the children achieve this is greatly appreciated.
