## Stretton Handley Church of England (VC) Primary School

### Positive Behaviour Policy



This policy should be read in conjunction with other policies and information relating to safeguarding and Child Protection, including: Anti-bullying Policy; Safeguarding Policy; Equalities Policy; Keeping Children Safe in Education.

We recognise that most children behave well for most of the time. We want to celebrate this and ensure that children remain motivated and rewarded for maintaining good behaviour. However, we also recognise that some children struggle to make positive choices and may need more encouragement and support to make the right choices. Our system has been developed and reviewed so that everyone understands the expectations of positive behaviour.

#### The Golden Rules

The classroom rules are devised and agreed by the children in each group at the beginning of each school year. These are displayed in each classroom as a visual reminder of the expectations we have about behaviour. They are based around the following key points:

- We are kind, polite and respect others.
- \* We try our best, work hard and learn from our mistakes.
- \* We listen carefully to others without interrupting them.
- \* We look after our own and respect other people's belongings.
- \* We tell the truth.
- \* We treat other people the way we would like to be treated.

#### Why do we have these rules?

#### We believe that:

- Everyone has the right to feel safe, secure and fairly treated.
- Children have the right to learn and adults have the right to teach and support learning.
- Everyone deserves to be treated with politeness, respect and kindness.
- We need to look after school and each other's property carefully

#### Rewards for positive behaviour

Children are rewarded in the following ways:

- Verbal Praise
- Dojo Points
- Stickers/stamps
- Sending children to the Headteacher with work they are proud of
- Certificates
- Sharing Achievements in Friday Celebration Collective Worship
- Celebration activities/events

#### Dojo Points can be given for:

- Work / Achievement
- # Fffort
- Behaviour

All staff may give points/stickers and praise positive things, especially effort and behaviour to promote all round achievement.

Children collect dojo points during the school week. For every 100 dojo points children can choose a prize from the prize pot. The dojo points add up over a year.

## Celebration Collective Worship


Certificates / stickers and awards are presented in our Celebration Collective Worship, which is usually held on Friday afternoons.

The following awards are given each week:

- Kind and Courteous
- Star of the Week
- Head Teacher's award
- Lunchtime award
- \* School Council award
- Church Council award
- Playground Buddy award

## Ready to Learn Ladder

Our 'ladder' behaviour system provides an effective way to promote positive behaviour in the classroom. It allows for recognition of pupils who are always ready to learn and supports those who need support focussing on their learning. It is a fair approach and ensures that pupils know the rules and behaviours expected in school regardless of what classroom they are in or who is teaching them.



Each class has a <u>Ready to Learn Ladder</u>. Every child starts each day <u>Ready to Learn</u>. Children are encouraged and supported to move up the ladder by making <u>Great Choices</u> or <u>Outstanding Choices</u>.

The aim is for all children to make the most out of the time at school so they can reach their potential - children are supported to do this. The children have a Golden Time on Friday if they have remained Ready to Learn and made Great or Outstanding Choices during the week. There are a range of activities for Golden time including sports outside, free play outside, indoor activities which include ipads, colouring, craft activities and free play.

#### Consequences

Some children find it harder to make the positive choices which will help them achieve well in school. We believe in supporting our children to be ready to learn throughout the day. Sometimes, children need a reminder about our expectations in school. Consequences are clear and understood by all children. Our consequences are based on the school ethos that all children have the right to learn, and all teachers have the right to teach.
